Conference Reports

Please give details on the panels, presentations and other social events you attended, your own presentation/s, researchers you were able to meet and how your research may benefit from your participation.

Word limit: 1,000 words

Research Reports

Ph.D. students (at advanced stages of their research) and other researchers can submit a research report in order to share the results of their fieldwork and/or some reflections on their own research. Research reports should include in-text citations and a list of references. Word limit: 1,000 words

Tomorrow's Researchers Today

Ph.D. (or exceptional M.A. and M.Phil.) students in the initial stages of their research are invited to submit a paper for this section. These papers are primarily meant to inform the community about new researchers and developing projects, rather than to provide research results. Therefore, references are not necessarily required.

Word limit: 500 words
